### What Is Truth?

## A Study in the Book of the Revelation

In Ancient Rome, the cult of the emperor flourished in the province of Asia more than anywhere else in the entire empire. The result? By the end of the first Christian century, a showdown between the early church in all of its weaknesses, and the almighty state with all of its splendour and might.

The Apostle John is exiled to the island of Patmos, and it is there that he sees a wondrous and fantastic vision that puzzles him, and frankly, has puzzled many people within the church and without, for millennia.

John sees a vision that gives context to his clash with the ruling authorities of his day, and yet, he also sees the conflict in the larger cosmic context between God (and his Christ) and Satan (12.1-9) in which God wins eternal salvation for his people.

Our present role, as followers of Jesus, is to "triumph over (Satan) by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of our testimony,...not loving our lives so much as to shrink from death" (12.11). As God has already defeated the dragon through the death and resurrection of Christ (the Messiah is caught up to heaven, 12.5), so he will judge the state for her crimes against his people.

The challenge, since the original recipients of John's letter received it, was to remain faithful to God through Jesus. Things haven't changed much in two thousand years. Followers of Jesus are still challenged to live their lives for Jesus and in direct opposition to Satan.

Some of the questions we'll wrestle with along the way, will include, "Who are we?" "Who or what has Lordship over our lives?" "What are we doing to remain faithful to God?" "What have we forgotten?" "Who is our enemy?"

My hope is that as we continue to journey together, that we discover that the book of Revelation is really nothing new under the sun. It is just the Truth, presented in a new way, through the Holy Spirit, to a faithful follower, the Apostle John.
